

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, established in 1915, Holy Family Cathedral was the first church in downtown Anchorage with priests tending to our earliest resident's needs, and this year joins the *Anchorage Centennial Citywide Celebration*; and

WHEREAS, Alaska's Statehood in 1959 and the 1964 Great Alaskan Earthquake drew more people to Alaska, and in 1966 Rome announced the creation of the Archdiocese of Anchorage, and soon after, Archbishop Joseph T. Ryan began serving the cathedral; and

WHEREAS, in 1981 Saint Pope John Paul II visited the cathedral, where he prayed, adored the Eucharist and blessed parishioners, before celebrating Mass on the Park Strip, which was the largest gathering of Alaskans in one place, to date; and

WHEREAS, over the past century, Holy Family has grown to reflect the diversity of Anchorage, with more than 750 families attending, including citywide residents and cultural groups, including foreign-speaking populations from Mexico, Latin America, the Dominican Republic, Philippines and Europe, and its downtown location allows ministry to homeless teens and adults, as well as a number of tourists especially in the summer months; and

WHEREAS, today, together with new Cathedral of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Holy Family serves as the archbishop's parish and offers monthly newsletters, a youth education program, prayer groups, book club, parish nurses, adult faith classes, and active parishioner chapters that serve the cathedral and community, as Holy Family continues to be a beacon of faith and hope in the heart of our city.

Holy Family Cathedral's 100 Years

IN Anchorage and I join all local residents in celebrating with our city's first downtown church that will forever be part of our Centennial History.

**Important Dates in the Life of
Holy Family Cathedral**

May 13, 1779 Catholic priests on board the Spanish vessel, Sonora, celebrate the first recorded Catholic Mass in Bucareli Bay, near modern Ketchikan. It was the Feast of the Ascension.

July 10, 1915 At the direction of Fr. Van der Pol, A. J. Tony Wendler purchases the lots for Holy Family Church at the public land auction that starts the city of Anchorage.

September 15, 1915 Ground breaking for the construction of the church.

October 17, 1915 First Mass in Holy Family Church.

December 12, 1915 Installation of the Blessed Sacrament in the holy tabernacle.

1933 Father Robert Dermot O’Flanagan becomes Pastor of Holy Family Church. He will remain Pastor until 1951.

1933 The Ladies Altar Society is formed.

1935 Alaska Catholic Newspaper is published.

June 19, 1939 The Sisters of Providence open Providence Hospital at 9th Avenue and L Street.

July 24, 1947 Ground breaking begins construction of the new church.

December 14, 1947 First Mass held in the basement of the still uncompleted new church.

December 24, 1948 The altar is moved from the basement to the first floor and the Midnight Mass is celebrated.

1949 Father Harley Baker arrives as the first assistant Pastor.

1950’s Planning and fundraising begins for new parishes in the Anchorage Area, beginning with Spenard (St. Juliana’s, now St. Benedict’s), Mountain View (St. Anthony’s) and Eagle River/Chugiak (St. Andrew’s) the first three.

July 9, 1951 Fr. O’Flanagan is appointed as the first Bishop

of Alaska.

1952 The Ladies Altar Society opens the Little Flower Gift Shop in the old church.

1959 Alaska becomes the 49th state.

1959 Knights of Columbus Lady of Snows Council #4859 is established.

1962 Catholic Junior High opens on Fireweed Lane.

1963 First local chapter (praesidium) for Legion of Mary is established.

March 27, 1964 (Good Friday) 9.2 Alaska Earthquake. Holy Family Church sustains only minor damage. A visit by Most Reverend Egidio Vagnozzi to assess the damage, leads to his recommendation to Pope Paul VI that a new archdiocese be formed with Anchorage as its center.

1966 The Archdiocese of Anchorage is created. Monsignor John Joseph T. Ryan is chosen as its first Archbishop. Holy Family Church becomes Holy Family Cathedral.

1968 Fr. Crowley initiates the Native Apostolate.

July 1974 At the invitation of Archbishop Ryan, the Dominicans come to Holy Family. Father Frank Bede Wilks is the first Dominican Pastor.

1979 Bean’s Café opens.

February 26, 1981 Pope John Paul II visits Anchorage and celebrates a Mass on the Anchorage Park Strip.

1986 Brother Francis Shelter opens.

1988 McMahon Building is purchased (currently the Holy Family Center).

1992 Parish Office is relocated to corner of 6th Ave and H Street .

2008 Cathedral remodel is completed.

2011 Holy Family Center remodel is completed.
